NEET PG Admission in India

NEET PG serves as the gateway for admission toMD/MS and other postgraduate medical coursesacross India. The examination assesses candidates'theoretical and practical knowledge. Key aspectsinclude:

- Eligibility: MBBS degree and completion of acompulsory internship.
- Application: Online registration, submission of documents, and payment of fees.
- Examination: Computer-based test covering various medical subjects.
- Counseling: Conducted by the Medical Counseling Committee (MCC) and respective state authorities for seat allocation.

Candidates aiming for seats under the NRI Quota must fulfill additional requirements, including valid NRI status documentation.

NRI Quota Admission in India

The NRI Quota reserves a certain percentage of seats in medical colleges for Non-Resident Indians. This quota is available for both undergraduate (MBBS) and postgraduate (MD/MS) courses. Eligibility criteria typically include:

- NRI Status: Candidates must be NRIs, Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs), or Overseas Citizens of India (OCIs).
