The sanctuary where the elephants are being relocated offers a safe space for them to develop the ?k???? needed for independent living and to eventually integrate into w??d herds that roam the area.

The transportation of the seven elephants, weighing a ?om???ed ten tons, was a complex operation. The process began with tranquilizing the elephants to calm them.

Teams closely monitored their ??t?? signs, such as breathing and ?e??t rate, before securing them with straps to be hoisted onto a flatbed truck using a crane. Experts deemed this method the safest and most efficient.

Once on the truck, each elephant was transported to a "wake-up ?ox," where the effects of sedation were reversed, allowing them to ?t??d.
