- Tracking and evaluating the outcomes

However, the ISO 14001:2015 standard mandates that several aspects of operational control be evaluated, managed, and recorded as information, either in the [environmental policy](#) itself or in other documents:

- The obligations of law and compliance must be fulfilled
- Environmental goals need to be evaluated and established
- It is essential to define internal processes
- Procedures that are external and outsourced need to be specified and managed
- The need for competency and [ISO 14001 awareness training](#) must be determined, put into practice, and evaluated
- It is necessary to conduct analyses and take corrective action
