- 5. Balmoral Castle (Aberdeenshire, Scotland):
 - Balmoral Castle is another private residence used by the Queen and her family for holidays and private stays. It is set amidst the stunning landscapes of the Scottish Highlands.
- 6. Clarence House (London, England):
