As the Golden State Warriors continue to search for a second NBA star to pair with Stephen Curry, Brandon Ingram's name has surfaced in trade talks. However, despite the interest, it appears unlikely that the Warriors will pursue a deal for the New Orleans Pelicans forward.

Ingram Doesn't Seem to Be a Consensus Trade Target

The Warriors are still exploring options before the trade deadline to improve their roster. Brandon Ingram is mentioned as a potential scorer, but the team may not pursue him.

Despite Brandon Ingram's offensive talent and his potential compatibility with Stephen Curry, reports suggest that he's not seen as a guaranteed acquisition for the Golden State Warriors. According to Jordan Poole's report, the team's leadership, headed by general manager Mike Dunleavy Jr., is cautious about giving up a first-round pick unless the deal is viewed as a "can't-miss" opportunity. As it stands, Ingram doesn't seem to reach that level of interest for the Warriors' front office.

Warriors Remain Cautious Ahead of Trade Deadline

The Warriors, who have been expected to retool after a disappointing 2023-24 season, are still searching for the right pieces to complement Curry and elevate them back into the upper echelon of the Western Conference. However, as Poole noted, the team has taken a measured approach to roster construction since Kevin Durant's departure in 2019.



The potential acquisition of Chris Paul earlier in the offseason is a prime example of Golden State's cautious approach. The Warriors are looking to make smart, calculated moves that add depth and versatility to the roster rather than sacrificing core pieces for a player who may not be the ideal fit.

Ingram's offensive game is well-regarded, and he would add another layer of play alongside Curry, but there are concerns about his ability to significantly elevate the team.

Additionally, his fit within the Warriors' system, which relies heavily on movement and unselfish play, may not be seamless. For a franchise with championship aspirations, every move must be carefully scrutinized, and according to Poole's sources, Ingram simply doesn't check enough boxes.
