Specialty Shops

Some shops focus just on crane parts. They're like those specialty car part stores, but for cranes. Many keep old Kobelco crane parts in stock, knowing someone will need them someday.

Online Groups

There are groups of crane owners online who help each other out. I've seen amazing things happen – like someone in Texas finding the exact [P&H crane parts](#) needed by someone in New York.

Used Parts Places

Don't overlook places that sell used parts. Sometimes, you can find perfectly good Kobelco crane parts from older cranes that aren't being used anymore. It's like finding treasure!
