Statutory holidays in New Brunswick are specific daysthat the provincial government recognizes on whichqualified employees are entitled to a day off with pay. Since they are legally mandated, employers mustadhere to related regulations.

Statutory Holiday Pay Rules in New Brunswick

The following are the stat holiday pay rules in the province:

- All employees working on a stat holiday are entitled to 1.5 times regular wages forhours worked.
- Qualified employees who work on a general holiday earn their regular day's pay plus 1.5 times their regular wages for the hours worked. If they do not work, they receive a regular day's pay.
- Employees who do not qualify for statutory holiday pay earn 1.5 times their regular wages for the hours they worked but do not receive wages if they do not work on a statutory holiday.

To be eligible for a paid stat holiday, an employee must meet the following:
