- The <u>Crime Severity Index (CSI)</u> data is fromCanada Crime Index. Higher figures meana higher level of crime severity, while lowerfigures indicate community vitality.
- The Cost of Living, Crime Index, and SafetyIndex data are from Numbeo.
  - Crime Index estimates the overall crimelevel in a city:
    - Scores lower than 20 very low
    - Between 20 and 40 low
    - Between 40 and 60 moderate
    - Between 60 and 80 high
    - Higher than 80 very high
  - As for the Safety Index, if the value is 0, it means safety is perceived as very low.
    If the value is 100, there is a very high perception of safety.
