What is EI In Canada?

Employment Insurance (EI) in Canada is a program that provides temporary financial support to unemployed workers who are actively seeking employment.

It offers regular benefits for those who lost their jobs through no fault of their own and special benefits to individuals who cannot work due to illness, pregnancy, and other important life events that they must prioritize over work.

The Canada Employment Insurance Commission ([CEIC](#)) oversees the management of the EI program while being supported by Service Canada, which processes claims, conducts authentications, and prevents fraud.

How Much Can You Get Paid From EI?

The exact amount you'll receive from EI will only be calculated once the government receives and processes your application. Most applicants receive up to 55% of their average [insurable](#) weekly earnings from this program for a maximum of \$650 weekly.

When Do You Start Getting Paid EI?

You won't immediately get covered by EI after applying for the program. The initial week following your application is designated as a waiting period, comparable to deductibles in other insurance categories.

Once your eligibility for the program is confirmed, you can expect to receive payments from EI about 28 days after submitting your application. The first payment will encompass the benefits you're entitled to starting from the second week.
