According to Economic Research Institute (ERI), 2023 data forSummerside, Prince Edward Island, the cost of living is 4% belowthe national average, dragged down by the high affordability offood, housing, and health care services. Moreover, in June 2023,the median list price in Summerside was \$370,423, up by 2% sinceMay.

According to Numbeo, goods and services, including rental fees in Summerside, PEI, are 32.1% lower than in Toronto. While comparing the overall cost of living of Summerside to the nearby New Glasgow in Nova Scotia, Summerside still stands lower at 3.9%.
