Bayless Criticizes Kerr's Officiating Complaints After Warriors' Loss

Bayless responded to Steve Kerr's frustration over officiating during the Warriors' 91-90 loss to the Rockets. Bayless criticized Kerr for focusing on a foul on Jonathan Kuminga with three seconds left instead of addressing the Warriors' late-game mistakes, including turnovers and out-of-bounds violations that allowed Houston to rally.

Jalen Green's clutch free throws sealed the Rockets' comeback, extending their winning streak against Golden State. While the foul call on Kuminga was questionable, it highlighted Golden State's inability to close out games.



Now 14-10, the Warriors have dropped seven of their last nine games, slipping in the Western Conference standings. Consistency and late-game execution remain critical issues as they prepare to host the Mavericks at the AT&T Center.
