

How to Get a Voided Check Without a Checkbook

Simply write "VOID" across the check using black ink. Make sure you print clearly so that it's easy to read the word.

That's really all there is to it; it's a simple process. When you void a check, you leave the check information visible but make it unusable for funds. This can come in handy for some things, as you'll soon find out.

When Should I Use a Void Check?
