4. Check Durability and Absorption

Ceramic and porcelain tiles vary in quality. Some are dense and water-resistant, while others absorb moisture, leading to stains or damage.

Choose tiles with low water absorption for bathrooms. For floors, select a higher PEI rating for durability. Wall tiles can be less tough. When buying premium bathroom tiles, ensure their quality lives up to the name.
