







## Best Tank Games for PC: A Ride Through Heavy Metal Battles

Tanks are massive iron machines designed to crush enemies, and are among the most important military equipment. It's no surprise that these giants have captured the attention of video game developers, as many players dream of commanding a tank, and we can [bet](#) that you haven't heard about all the titles, even if you are into gaming. Let's explore the best tank games for PC.

### War Thunder

In War Thunder, tanks aren't the only form of transport, but they remain one of the main ones alongside planes, helicopters, and other military vehicles. The key task, as in previous projects, is to destroy enemies in team battles, but the variety of modes spices up the routine. From arcade mode (with simple controls and respawns) to realistic mode (with detailed damage simulation), War Thunder offers it all. Developers are actively updating the game, which already boasts more than two thousand units of equipment.

### World of Tanks

Battles take place in forests, fields, and other spacious locations with sparse structures. Ongoing events with rewards encourage players to continue fighting in team battles and beyond. Additionally, World of Tanks features unique elements, as the developers host crossovers with stars, brands, and even other games, including the visual novel Endless Summer.

### Armored Warfare

In Armored Warfare, players not only control tanks but also command infantry, setting this simulator apart from similar games. Most vehicles are modeled after real designs from various eras, from the 1950s to the near future. Currently, Armored Warfare features over 300 types of tanks. Cooperative modes add extra variety, complementing team battles. The fights take place in diverse locations: from Chinese mountains and African deserts to modern urban jungles.

### ShellShock Live

ShellShock Live is an unusual tank game for children on PC. It features arcade-style gameplay, simple controls, and vibrant graphics. The arena is viewed from the side, and players move back and forth in two-dimensional space. You can play solo against bots or in battles with up to eight people. Despite its simple appearance, ShellShock Live has a progression system with experience, levels, and rewards for reaching new heights. For example, players can buy new weapons and upgrade their tank's characteristics, all without any in-game purchases.

### Tank Force

Tank Force is for those who are tired of World of Tanks or Armored Warfare. The gameplay is similar — fight in tank battles on realistic maps. The graphics may not be top-tier, but the developers still pushed the engine to its limits, which is evident not only in the landscapes but also in the detailed tank models. A major advantage of Tank Force is its cross-platform compatibility, allowing players from different platforms to battle together, from smartphones to Steam.

### Tokyo Warfare Turbo

At first glance, Tokyo Warfare Turbo seems like another tank simulator, but the picture is deceiving. Instead of frequent updates and tank upgrades, there's a one-time purchase, giving players a set of tanks from different eras for arcade battles. The key mechanic is the ability to switch between an "anime" visual style and a realistic one at the press of a button. One of the few
